Keith Greentree and myself (Cathy Parsons) both attended the second round at Wakefield Park and had a good day flag marshalling at turn 4. I am sure we stood out in our orange RB Imports Series t-shirts. I must say I expected there to be a lot more action at our flag point as the day started off with the first rider in the first practice session dropping his bike on the first lap in the first right hander. Perhaps tyre warmers would have been a good option. The 250cc & Single Cylinder guys & girl were giving us the best action with riders diving underneath each other at our flag point. There were some exciting moves from Gavin Hainsworth and Jamie Hagney in the 251 – 400cc races. The 799-1300cc and 450-750cc & 250 GP guys seemed to be playing it on the safe side. There was a bit of a mix up with the lunch break, no one seemed to know when it was going to be. We finally got back to the pits with only time to eat a sandwich and have a cup of coffee before it was time to go back out. So much for having a friendly chat with the riders.
